

Title - Mental Health

Highlights -

- Discuss how the pandemic and other disasters experienced over the past two years emotionally impacted you and/or your employees/friends/family.
- Participants will be coached on strategies to prevent burnout, manage feeling overwhelmed and chronically
 exhausted by engaging in healthy activities that rejuvenate us emotionally.
- Assess your ability to promote mental a meaningful mental health literacy strategy in your workplace or community.

Bio – Jason Haglund, MS, CADC - As owner of Haglund Consulting LLC., Haglund provides behavioral health subject matter expertise, public policy analysis and executive coaching based in Story City. Understanding the uniqueness of rural lowa, Haglund strays beyond his professional experiences and draws upon the lessons he has learned from his own multigenerational family farm. As co-owner of Boone County based Hickory Grove Family Farm, Haglund is the 5th generation to continue the family farming tradition. Keeping up with the constant evolving pace of science, technology, and management of uncertainty can be overwhelming. Haglund understands firsthand juggling all of this is required to own and operate a technology informed, financially viable, sustainable family business. This unique perspective affords Haglund to lead engaging, relatable discussions on topics such as stress management, emotional wellness and burnout.

Title - Industrial Hygiene

Highlights -

- Attendees will be able to explain the topics that Industrial Hygiene covers, and how they help anticipate, recognize, evaluate, control, and confirm the protection of employees from workplace hazards.

- Given key items needed for a successful industrial hygiene assessment, attendees will be able to construct a basic plan for preparing and conducting a basic industrial hygiene assessment.

Bio – Christina Roll has developed a unique skillset in her career, starting with occupational safety, health and environmental consulting, moving into safety management and leadership with the US Marine Corps. For the last nine years she has been a risk engineer/risk consultant with two large insurance carriers. She works with clients in a wide variety of industries including hospitality, manufacturing, finance and retail to help identify and mitigate business and operational risks. Ms. Roll specializes in occupational safety & health hazard identification, evaluation, mitigation and control. Her strengths include workplace risk assessments, office and industrial ergonomic training and assessments, industrial hygiene assessments, OSHA compliance, and occupational safety and health training.

Title - IOSHA Update

Highlights -

- Update Iowa Safety Professionals on new safety standards in the state of Iowa.
- Inform Iowa Safety Professionals on incidents and trends for year 2021.

Bio – Peggy Peterson is a veteran of the Persians Gulf War – where her mission was receiving, storing, and supplying blood to hospitals and mobile units in-country. Peggy has been a state of lowa employee since 1988. She joined the Division of Labor as a safety enforcement officer in 1990, became a safety and health consultant for the Division in 1994, a Sr. Industrial Hygienist in 1999, and THE Complaint Officer 2013-2020. She was honored to provide assistance at the World Trade Center after 9-11 and in New Orleans, LA after hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005. Peggy was introduced as a special guest at the Condition of the State address in 2002. She was part of the after-action review team for the ground zero response. Peggy was one of the first employees in the Division of Labor to become an OSHA 10-hour trainer in both construction and general industry and has trained both employees and employers throughout the state. She has served as a VPP (Voluntary Protection Program) team leader. She has represented the state of lowa in several conferences throughout the United States. Reluctantly becoming an expert with video conferences (which means she knows where the mute button can be found).

Title – Confined Space Rescue & Fall Protection

Highlights -

- Describe what a leading edge is and the hazards that poses for traditional "tie-off" configurations
- Understand hazards and concerns related to tie-off with front D-Rings

- Recognize the right harness style for each employee
